In attendance were police officers, judges, lawyers, and court staff






THE EASTERN CARIBBEAN SUPREME COURT Lie EDUCATION CAMPAIGN






THE AI-POWERED LEGAL INFORMATION TOOL

The potential of strengthening our formal Communication Channels, Mutual Legal Assistance Capacity and Prosecution Mechanisms were discussed, to deter criminal gangs from operating between our Federation and neighboring French Territories, such as St. Martin, St. Barths, Guadeloupe and Martinique. A commitment was made to work together, from the Justice perspective, to fight this war on organized crime in our subregion.
